

Guests travelling on a Whitsunday Rent A Yacht Bareboat have the opportunity to do an Introductory or a Certified Scuba Dive while sailing around the Whitsunday Islands.

The Scuba Dive Service is offered by 'Tornado Dive' which is a rendezvous service.

The Dives will take place in the general area of North Hook Island or Blue Pearl Bay off Hayman Island or the Langford Reef Area.

These locations offer amazing fish life and the soft coral reefs grow right from the edge of the islands.

3 While on your Bareboat Charter, call Tornado on VHF Channel 82, the Day before the dive, so we can schedule divers into the daily program

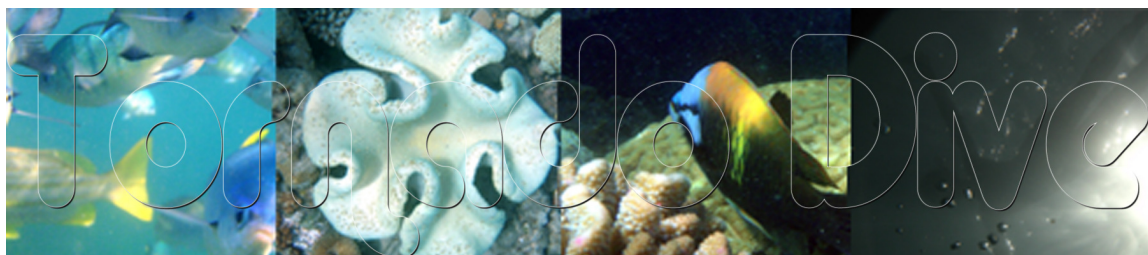
4 Meet up with Tornado at the designated time and location

5 For Intro Divers, complete the Medical Dive Clearance Form, have a Dive & Safety Brief, Kit Up, Practice and then enjoy a dive for 25 to 35 minutes, to a depth of up to 8 metres with our qualified Dive Instructor.

For Certified Divers, (don't forget your certification card), Kit Up and go diving with one of our qualified Dive Instructors.

For guests who decide to dive while on charter, please contact Whitsunday Rent a Yacht Office and ask them to book the dive for you.

Dive Medical Background information

Before booking a Scuba Diving with Tornado Dive, we need you to be aware of the following information, which has been supplied by PADI. A document containing this information will be provided to you on the day you do your dive and you will need to complete it and sign it prior to completing your dive.

MEDICAL HISTORY

The purpose of this medical questionnaire is to find out if you should be examined by your doctor before participating in recreational scuba diving. A positive response to a question does not necessarily disqualify you from diving. A positive response means that there is a pre-existing condition that may affect your safety while diving and you must seek the advice of your physician.

Please answer the following questions on your past or present medical history with a **YES** or **NO**. If you are not sure, answer **YES**. If any of these items apply to you, we must request that you consult with a physician prior to participating in scuba diving.

- Could you be pregnant or are you attempting to become pregnant?
- Do you regularly take prescription or non-prescription medications? (with the exception of birth control)
- Are you over 45 years of age and have one or more of the following:
 - currently smoke a pipe, cigars or cigarettes?
 - have a high cholesterol level?
 - have a family history of heart attacks or strokes?

Have you ever had or do you currently have...

- Asthma, or wheezing with breathing, or wheezing with exercise?
- Frequent or severe attacks of hay fever or allergy?
- Frequent colds, sinusitis or bronchitis?
- Any form of lung disease?
- Pneumothorax (collapsed lung?)
- History of chest surgery?
- Claustrophobia or agoraphobia (fear of closed or open spaces)?
- Behavioral health problems?
- Epilepsy, seizures, convulsions or do you take medications to prevent them?
- Recurring migraine headaches or do you take medications to prevent them?
- History of blackouts or fainting (full or partial loss of consciousness)?
- Do you frequently suffer from motion sickness (seasick, carsick, etc.?)
- History of diving accidents or decompression sickness?
- History of recurrent back problems?
- History of back surgery?
- History of diabetes?
- History of back, arm or leg problems following surgery, injury or fracture?
- Inability to perform moderate exercise (example: walking one mile within 12 minutes)?
- History of high blood pressure or do you take medication to control blood pressure?
- History of any heart disease?
- History of heart attacks?
- Angina or heart surgery or blood vessel surgery?
- History of ear or sinus surgery?
- History of ear disease, hearing loss or problems with balance?
- History of problems equalizing (popping) ears with airplane or mountain travel?
- History of bleeding or other blood disorders?
- History of any type of hernia?
- History of ulcers or ulcer surgery?
- History of colostomy?
- History of Drug or Alcohol Abuse?
